#### The Same, but Different?

Monarchical Rule and Representation in the Hellenistic World

Edited by Christoph Michels

When Hellenistic kingship – with its "charismatic", to some extent even excessive character – emerged in the wake of Alexander, it was perceived already by conries as something genuinely new. This can be observed above all in the reception of central symbolic forms of expression and practices by non-Macedonian rulers. However, scholars have also emphasized the multifaceted nature of monarchical rule in the Hellenistic age. On the one hand, important impulses for the monarch's persona came from the culture-specific rea-sons for obedience (Weber) on the part of his respective subjects. On the other hand, the development of a monarchical habitus was shaped by the specific configuration of the multipolar Hellenistic world system: royal competition was carried out as one among peers, before a public that was in essence culturally Greek The studies collected in this volume focus on the development of concepts of rule and ideologemes as well as the cross-fertilization between the Hellenistic dynasties and in conversation with local traditions of rule. Finally, the authors address the question as to what extent the coming of Rome brought about a turning point for monarchical representation.



### An Undertakers' Archive from the Kynopolite Nome

(P. Kynopolites)

G. BAETENS & W. CLARYSSE

This book provides a comprehensive edition of five well-preserved Greek papyri from an archive of undertakers (nekrotaphoi) from the late Ptolemaic Kynopolite nome, four of which unpublished. The texts contain a wealth of information on mummification practices and funerary taxation in this era, in particular concerning the use of the embalming products kedria (Egyptian sfj) and pharmakon (Egyptian phr.t), the traditional seventy-day funerary period, and a mummification procedure in which bodies are temporarily buried in the sand. All this and more is discussed in an extensive commentary co Greek and Egyptian evidence.

The project «Corpus of Greek and Latin philosophical Papyri: Texts and Lexicon» (CPF) has been running since 1983: it aims to collect the papyri discovered in Egypt from Greco-Roman times preserving Greek and Latin texts con-cerning philosophy. Starting from the Hellenistic age and continuing to the end of the Roman age, the CPF collects in continuing to the end of the Roman age, the CMF collects in Part I the philosophical texts on papyrus of known authors (most of them covered by medieval transmission), provided with biographical and doxographical references. A specific volume of Part II.2 and II.3 are devoted to papyrus fragments of the so-called 'gnomic' literature — moral maxims and precepts that on the borderline between philosophy and educational tools. This genre was highly significant in the context of secondary education and spiritual training in antiquity. Sixteen volumes have appeared so far (including indexes and plates). rently being prepared (three volumes have been published so far, and an equal number will be needed to complete it); This part deals with philosophical fragments classified in papyrological repertoires as 'philosophical', but not immediately assignable to an author. The most important schools of antiquity are involved. This section offers a comprehensive collection that has never before been attempted – neither in papyrology nor in the field of ancient philosophy – and thus provides an unique overview of the philosophical content preserved on papyrus. To date a total of 56 text have been published in these three volumes: they account for more than half of the texts to be included in this section of the CPF. 




#### STUDI E TESTI PER IL CORPUS DEI PAPIRI FILOSOFICI GRECLE LATINI

Since 1985, a dedicated series of studies has been launched to explore specific topics in greater depth and to publish annotated editions of individual fragments. These often stem from more detailed analyses of papyri already included in the Corpus dei Papiri Filosofici (CPF), where they had originally been presented with only brief commentary. In this series, titled «Studi C Testi per il Corpus dei Papiri Filosofici» (STCPF), eighteen volumes have been published so far. Since the first one (STCPF, 1 with the new edition of Paparis 2-Peri aponhatikon, republished afresh in the last far. Since the first one (STCPF, 1 with the new edition of P.Paris 2, Peri apophatikon, republished afresh in the last CPF volume I.1\*\*\*, 2023), many of the preliminary studies or editions prepared for the CPF have brought notable progress to the study of many authors. These include, for instance, Isocrates (STCPF vol. 12), Menandri Sententiae (text based on a new collation of all the manuscripts and the editions of previously unpublished recensions, edited by C. Pernigotti, STCPF, vol. 15) or the first edition of the Derveni Papyrus (T. Kouremenos, G. Parássoglou, K. Tsantsanoglou, STCPF, vol. 13) along with a groundbreaking and in-depth study on the Derveni roll by V. Piano (STCPF, vol. 18). The latest volume (STCPF, vol. 19, 2024) breaking and in-depth study on the Derveni roll by V. Piano (STCPF, vol. 18). The latest volume (STCPF, vol. 19, 2024) celebrates the 40th anniversary of the editorial Project «Corpus dei Papiri Filosofici» (CPP). This volume is organized into two sections. Alongside contributions commemorating the founding (with the original photos of the meeting held in Florence, 1983) and early development of the CPF – as a project deeply rooted in interdisciplinarity and scholarly collaboration – the first section includes papers presented in Florence on June 15 and 16, 2023. These papers focus on papyri attributed either to philosophical schools (Such as the Evicureans) or to individual works (such as

in Florence on June 13 and 10, 2023. These papers Jocus on papyrr attributed either to philosophical schools (such as the Epicureans) or to individual works (such as Hierocles' Ethical Elements), whose editions – published within the CPF – have served, and in many cases continue to serve, as reference editions for papyrologists and scholars of ancient philosophy worldwide. The second section of the volume features contributions devoted to other papyri of particular relevance to the editorial history of the CPF, such as Antiphon's De Veritate, the anonymous commentary to Plato's Theaetetus, and the unattributed stoic fragment on moral progress preserved in P.Mil. Vogliano inv. 1241r.
